At our Reading Centre, you can enjoy a range of top-class facilities at one of the world's top 200 universities. This includes accommodation of a very high standard in halls of residence that opened in 2010, a stylish new dining hall, a disco/party room and excellent sports facilities which include an indoor sports centre and 3G football pitches. Reading (population 235,000) is a large, historic and modern town. It's ideally located, being only one hour from Central London by road and 35 minutes by train, as well as being close to Oxford and Windsor.

Residential Accommodation

- Full board accommodation arranged by Lewis School
- Single en-suite rooms with shared kitchen, in modern residences of a high standard
- 10-minute walk across campus to classrooms; 3 minutes to dining hall
- Bed linen provided (laundry of bed linen included)
- For washing of clothes, there is a coin-operated laundry. Students required to pay for use of laundry.
- Wi-Fi available in residence and other selected places on campus for a one-off fee of £2
